Just a quick reminder of some dates and important information now that we have been back at school for a few weeks.

Buddy system

The children have settled well and are enjoying being able to be back together. Our new Reception children are now attending full-time and have been busy making new friends and enjoying all of their new routines. Each Reception child has been allocated a 'buddy' from Year 5 or 6 and they have spent some time over the last couple of weeks getting to know each other. The idea of the buddy system is that each Reception child has an older person to share activities with, such as reading , and that they have someone that they can go to if they need any help or are not sure of something.
