



Questioning within the 5 E model of teaching and learning

Questioning that is going to inspire to hook the children in to the concept or topic. You may ask the children what are their experiences.



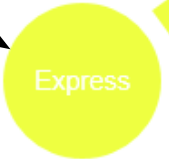
Use broad questions to draw out prior knowledge and learn what misconceptions the children have. Also what the children would like to find out.



Questions should help children understand the concept or topic. They will become more focused and start allowing the children to try out new knowledge and apply it.



Questions to be used to help children understand the new concept and apply their new knowledge to a final task.



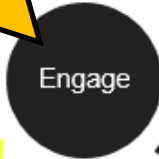
Questions from the enquire stage could be used to assess how far the children's understanding of the concept or topic has moved on.

Have you ever seen/been to...?
What did you enjoy about...?
How did you find out about that idea?

Tell me more about...?
What makes you think...?
How will you know if...?
What do you need to find out more about...?



How are you going to use your understanding of...?
Can you explain...?
What will you do when?
How can you prove that?
What will happen if...?
How do you know?



What do you think others think about this...?
How is this idea different from...?
Some people say...does this fit with your ideas?
How did you arrive at that idea?
How will you be able to tell...?



How has your ideas changed?
How is this different to...?
It seems you're not sure about...?
Do you have any questions about...?
What else might you need to know/do to be sure?
